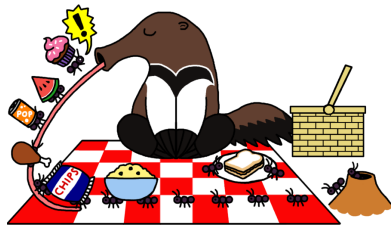

81.05 DOMESTIC ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED.
It shall be unlawful for any owner to allow any domestic animal of his to run at large within the village. At no time will a domestic animal be tied, penned or confined in the side area located between the residences, nor will a domestic animal house or domestic animal pen be placed in the side area located between the residences. Domestic animal houses and domestic animal pens shall be considered as an accessory building and the placement of such must conform with the village's regulations. The placement of a domestic animal house or domestic animal pen shall be in accordance with the zoning regulations of the village and located a minimum of 35 feet from a neighbor's residential dwelling.
