### Lake Wackena & Spring Lake

We have closed the gates on Spring Lake and plan to close the gates completely on Lake Wackena by the 15th of February. Please make sure you have all seawall work done by that date. Also please be sure you have all the necessary permits!

2017 Boat Stickers are now available at the Village Office.

You need your **current proof of insurance, registration and a completed application** (available at the office). All documentation must be **up-to-date** in order to get your boat sticker. There is no increase in the price of a sticker; residents \$50 each for a craft with a motor, \$25 without a motor. Remember last years sticker expired on 12/31/2016!

### Vegetative Yard Debris

The Breezewood debris site is officially **closed**. We have hired a contractor to remove all the debris accumulated from Hurricane Matthew. Our regular Compost site is back to its normal hours of operation. It is open from 1-5 on Wednesdays and 8-5 on Saturdays. As always the compost area is for the use of Village residents only! If you hire a contractor to clean your yard you must ride with them to bring the yard waste to the compost site. If you have any questions please call the office.

### WALNUT CREEK POLICE DEPARTMENT

**LEAD FOOT??** You may have noticed the Radar Trailer set up around the Village. We have a serious problem with speeders in the Village, both residents and non-residents. In an effort to make the roads safe for all, the Police Department will be enforcing the speed limit, which is **30 MPH** Village-wide unless other wise posted. Should you be caught exceeding the posted speed limit you may possibly be the lucky recipient of a citation. North Carolina is an **“Absolute Speed Limit”** state, there is **NO** “10 over rule”. These efforts are not to inconvenience drivers but to make the roads safe for all residents including those that are walking, jogging, riding bikes and walking their pets.
